

Chap. 66.

An Act to incorporate the Racine Female Seminary.

The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

Created a body corporate.

SECTION 1. That Isaac Taylor, Daniel Slauson, Isaac M. Hill, Reuben M. Norton, Orville W. Barnes, Chester W. White, Charles Herrick, Ezra F. Weed, Nelson A. Walker, Philo White, Eliphalet Crane, William Mosher, Walter Cooley, John Dorchester, Elisha Raymond, and Marshall M. Strong, and their successors, are hereby created a body corporate and politic, with the name and style of the Racine Female Seminary, and shall be trustees of said corporation, and for that purpose to remain in perpetual succession.

Powers.

SEC. 2. Said corporation shall have all the powers and privileges, and be subject to the restrictions and liabilities of chapter fifty-four of the revised statutes of Wisconsin, entitled, general provisions relating to corporations.

Further powers.

SEC. 3. The said trustees and their successors shall have power and authority to direct and prescribe the course of study and discipline in said institution, and also to direct and appoint a president or principal, and such professors, tutors, and teachers, and such other officers as said trustees shall deem proper; all of whom shall hold their offices during the pleasure of said trustees.

SEC. 4. The said trustees and their successors shall have power and authority to grant such literary honors and degrees as they may think best.

Term of trustee.

SEC. 5. The said trustees shall continue in office during their life or pleasure, unless removed as hereinafter provided. A majority of them shall constitute a quorum for doing business, and they shall have power to fill all vacancies in their numbers. Any trustees may be removed by a vote of two-thirds of the board.

May hold real estate.

SEC. 6. Said corporation shall have power to hold real estate sufficient for all necessary purposes connected with the institution.

SEC. 7. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.
