

CHAPTER 117.

Published November 18.

An Act to amend chapter 386 of the session laws of 1852, entitled "an act relating to hawkers and pedlars."

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. Chapter 386 of the session laws of 1852 is hereby so amended that it shall not hereafter be necessary for any person to obtain a license to sell or to travel from place to place for the purpose of carrying to sell any printed book, newspaper, pamphlet or map whether the same shall have been produced or printed in the state or not. Concerning
book pedlars.

SEC. 2. This act shall not authorize the sale or the traveling for the purpose of carrying to sell any immoral or obscene book, paper or pamphlet or playing cards.

SEC. 3. So much of chapter 386 of the session laws of 1852 or of any other law of this state as contravenes the provisions of this act are hereby repealed. Repealed.

SEC. 4. This act shall be in force and take effect from and after its passage.

An Act to accept the grant and execute the trust conferred upon the State of Wisconsin, by an act of Congress entitled "an act granting public lands to the State of Wisconsin to aid in the construction of railroads in said State," approved June 3d, 1856.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. That the lands, rights, powers and privileges, granted to and conferred upon the state of Wisconsin by the act of Congress, entitled "an act granting To accept
