

said county court to certify all actions and proceedings that may be pending in said county court and undetermined on said first day of March, 1859, to the said circuit court; and such certificate shall be sufficient evidence to authorize said circuit court to take jurisdiction of, and try and determine all such actions and proceedings. Certificate to be evidence.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage. Take effect.

CHAPTER 37.

AN ACT in addition to chapter eighty-six of the Revised Statutes, entitled "Of alienation by deed, of the proof and recording of conveyances, and the cancelling of mortgages."

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Deeds executed within this state, of lands or any interest in lands therein, owned by a corporation created under the laws of this state, shall be signed by the president or other authorized officer of the corporation, sealed with the seal of the corporation, and countersigned by the secretary or clerk thereof; and the person signing such deed may acknowledge the execution thereof before any officer authorized by law to take acknowledgments; and every such deed shall be admitted to record in the same manner and with like force and effect as if the same had been executed in conformity with the provisions of chapter eighty-six of the revised statutes, entitled "Of alienation by deed, of the proof and recording of conveyances, and the cancelling of mortgages." SEC. 2. This act shall be published immediately, and shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication. Take effect.
