

CHAPTER 117.

[Published March 21, 1860.]

AN ACT to restore William Greeno to citizenship.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. William Greeno, a late convict in the State Prison of this State, is hereby restored to citizenship, and shall enjoy the same rights and privileges, to all intents and purposes, which he had and was entitled to before his conviction. Restored to citizenship.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 118.

[Published March 21, 1860.]

AN ACT to make certain records in Brown county, evidence in certain cases.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The records of Brown county, made prior to January 1st, 1840, of deeds and mortgages of lands being in other counties at the time such records were made, (when it shall appear therefrom that such deeds and mortgages were duly executed and acknowledged) and certified copies of such records shall be *prima facie* evidence of the execution of such deeds and mortgages, and such records, and certified copies therefrom, shall be received in evidence in all courts and places, with the same effect as if such deeds and mortgages had been recorded in the county where the lands covered thereby are situated: *Provided*, that such evidence shall in no way interfere with or prejudice the rights of *bona fide* purchasers of any lands covered by any such deed or mortgage, without notice of the existence of such deed or mortgage; and *Provided further*, that no such notice shall, in any case, be presumed or implied. Records of Brown Co. to be used as evidence in other counties.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 119.

[Published March 29, 1860.]

AN ACT to amend sections thirty-five and forty-six, of chapter two, of the Revised Statutes, entitled "Of the division of the State into counties, and their boundaries."

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

Boundaries of Shawanaw Co. enlarged. SECTION 1. Townships twenty-eight, twenty-nine and thirty, of ranges fifteen, sixteen and seventeen east, now a part of Oconto county, in this State, be and the same are hereby cut off and detached from said Oconto county, and that all of said townships be and the same are hereby annexed to the county of Shawano [Shawanaw] in this State, and shall hereafter form a part and be included within the boundaries of said county of Shawano [Shawanaw.]

Menomonee Res. attached to Shawanaw Co. for judicial purposes. SEC. 2. As many of said townships as are embraced within the Menomonee Reservation are hereby attached to Shawano [Shawanaw] county for judicial purposes, and the inhabitants thereof are hereby empowered to vote for all county officers to be hereafter elected in said county, and on all subjects appertaining to county business in said county.

Boundaries further defined. SEC. 3. Townships number twenty-six and twenty-seven, of ranges number twelve and eleven east, are hereby defined as a part of Shawano [Shawanaw] county, and shall hereafter form a part and be included within the boundaries of said county.

Taxes of 1858 and 1859 legalized. SEC. 4. All taxes assessed for the year 1858 and 1859, by Shawano [Shawanaw] county, in any of the foregoing described townships, are hereby legalized and made payable to said county.

Repeal. SEC. 5. All acts or parts of acts contravening the provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

SEC. 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
