

## CHAPTER 27.

[Published February 6, 1860.]

AN ACT to extend the time for the payment and collection of the corporation taxes in the village of Oconto.

*The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :*

- Tax sale postponed.** SECTION 1. The sale of lands, now unsold, in the village of Oconto, by the treasurer of said village, upon which the taxes or assessments, levied for the year 1859, are now unpaid, is hereby postponed until the first Monday in April, 1860.
- Proceedings to col. taxes.** SEC. 2. The marshal of said village shall proceed to collect the taxes, as is provided by the act chartering said village, and return the same to the treasurer of said village, as provided by said act, on the first Monday in March, A. D. 1860.
- Tax sale first Mond. in April** SEC. 3. On said first Monday of April, the treasurer of said village shall commence the sale of lands, or lots, upon which the taxes or assessments levied, under the charter of said village, shall not have been paid, adding interest, at the rate of twelve per cent., from the first day of October, 1859, to that day, and shall continue the sale, from day to day, until the sale be completed. Such sale, and all subsequent acts and proceedings, shall be conducted by the treasurer, as now required by the charter of said village, except as herein provided, and all sales and certificates of sale, made in pursuance thereof, shall have the same validity and effect, as if such sale had taken place at the time and manner now prescribed by the village charter.
- How conducted.**
- Sales under this act valid.**
- To take effect.** SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage.
