

## CHAPTER 384.

[Published May 1, 1860.]

AN ACT to provide for the removal of the county seat of Dunn county.

*The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. At the annual election, to be held in the month of November next, the qualified electors of the county of Dunn may vote upon the question of the removal of the county seat of said county from Dunnville, (the present county seat), to the village of Menomonee, in said county of Dunn. Electors to vote.

SEC. 2. All votes given upon the question aforesaid shall be by ballot, upon which shall be written or printed either the words "For the removal of the county seat," or "Against the removal of the county seat;" said ballot shall be deposited in a separate box furnished by the inspectors of elections, and in case a majority of all the votes cast on the question shall be in favor of removal to the place above designated, then shall the village of Menomonee, the said place, be the county seat of said county. Nature of votes.

SEC. 3. The said votes shall be counted, canvassed, and certified and returned, in the same manner as is provided by law for counting, canvassing, returning and certifying the votes for county officers, and the clerk of the board of supervisors of said county shall record the result of the same in some record book, to be provided for that purpose, in his office, and transmit, without delay, a certified copy of such record to the Secretary of State, at Madison, who shall file and preserve the same. How votes counted, canvassed, &c.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
