

CHAPTER 254.

[Published April 24, 1861.]

AN ACT to establish a Highway.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Menasha and
Kaukana plank
road declared a
highway.

SECTION 1. The line of road of the Menasha and Kaukana plank road company, including their road-bed between the village of Menasha and the east side of Fox river, at or near the Kaukana Rapids, so called, having been abandoned by said company, the same is hereby declared and established as a public highway, and subject to the management and control of the towns in which the same lies, like other highways.

CHAPTER 255.

[Published April 24, 1861.]

AN ACT to lay out a state road from the mouth of Chippewa river, in Pepin county, to Chippewa Falls, in Chippewa county.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Commissioners.

SECTION 1. S. B. Washburn, Carroll Lucas and Rodman Palmer, are hereby appointed commissioners, with full power to lay out and establish a state road from the mouth of Chippewa river, in Pepin county, on the north side of said Chippewa river, to Chippewa Falls, in Chippewa county.

Salary.

SECTION 2. The said commissioners shall be entitled to receive a reasonable compensation for their services, which shall be audited by the boards of supervisors and paid by the county treasurers of the counties through which the said road shall pass; but no part of the expense of laying out said road shall be paid out of the state treasury.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
