CHAPTER 79.

[Published March 20, 1861.]

AN ACT to amend Chapter twelve of the Revised Statutes, entitled "Of Notaries Public."

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

How notice of protest served.

SECTION 1. Section five of chapter twelve of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out all after the word "residence," in the eleventh line of said section, and inserting in lieu thereof the words, "the said notice may be deposited in the post office nearest the residence or place of business of such notary public, post paid and directed to the person protested against, at the post office at which he usually receives his mail matter: *provided*, if the person protested against be not found by such notary public, notice left at the usual place of abode of said person protested against, in the presence of some one of the family of suitable age and discretion, shall be deemed personally served upon such person."

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
