AN ACT to amend chap. [chapter] 362 of the gen. [general] laws of 1860, entitled "an act relating to the Milwaukee county court."

CHAPTER 102.

[Published March 19, 1862.]

AN ACT to regulate the sale of poisons.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. No druggist, apothecary or other person dealing or trafficking in the same, shall sell or give away any poison or poisonous substances hereinafter enumerated, except practising physicians in their ordinary practice of medicine, without recording in a book, to be kept for that purpose, the name of the person receiving said poison, and his or her residence, together with the name and residence of some person as witness to such sale, excepting upon the written order or prescription of some practising physician, whose name must be attached to such order; and such book shall be kept open for inspection.

Name, &c., of person to be recorded.

SEC. 2. No person shall sell, give or dispose of any poison or poisonous substances, except upon the order or prescription of a practising physician, without attaching to the vial, box or parcel containing such poisonous substance, a label with the name and residence of such person, with the word "*poison*" printed or written upon it, together with the name of such poison written or printed thereon, in plain and legible characters.

Poison sold, &c., to be labeled.

SEC. 3. These provisions shall apply to the following poisonous substances, excepting when sold in wholesale quantities of one pound or over, viz.: arsenic, acconite, atropia and its salts, cantharides, canabis, indi-

cus, chloroform, corrosive sublimate, cyanurets of potassium, croton oil, dataria, deadly nightshade, digitales, delphifera and its salts, elaterium, ergot and its preparations, henbane, laudanum, mercury, morphine, nuxvomica, oil of bitter almonds, opium, oxalic acid, poison hemlock, prussic acid, silver, sugar of lead, strychnia, veratria and its salts, and zinc.

Penalty.

SEC. 4. Any person violating any of the provisions of this act, shall, upon conviction, be deemed guilty of misdemeanor, and shall be punished by a fine not exceeding fifty dollars.

SEC. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 103.

[Published March 20, 1862.]

AN ACT to amend chap. [chapter] 337 of the session laws of 1860 entitled "an act to incorporate religious societies."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

Incorporators.

SECTION 1. Section 1 of chapter 337 of the session laws of 1860, is hereby amended by inserting after the word "age" in the second line of said section, the words "not members of any religious congregation;" and section 4 of said chapter is hereby amended by striking out the word "five" where it last occurs in said section, and inserting the word "forty."

Explanatory.

SEC. 2. This act and the act to which this is amendatory, shall not be deemed to repeal any part of chapter 66 of the revised statutes, but said chapter 66 is hereby declared in full force, in so far as relates to the incorporation of religious societies where the persons becoming incorporators are, at the time of such incorporation, members of a religious society or congregation having regular meetings for divine worship.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
