CHAPTER 379.

AN ACT to authorize the quartermaster general to audit bills for subsisting and transporting volunteers of the Wisconsin cavalry regiments.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Authority to quartermaster general. Section 1. The quartermaster general is hereby authorized and required to audit all bills properly made out and certified, for subsisting and transporting to the place of rendezvous of their respective regiments, the volunteers of the Wisconsin cavalry regiments, and to draw warrants therefor upon the paymaster general, in the same manner that subsistence and transportation bills of volunteers of the Wisconsin infantry regiments are by law audited and warrants drawn therefor.

SECTION 2. If the duties of the quartermaster general shall be transferred to any other officer, then such

other officer shall perform the duties required by this act.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force r from and after its passage.
