

CHAPTER 77.

[Published March 10, 1862.]

AN ACT to authorize the village of Menasha to appropriate certain moneys.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. The president and board of trustees of the village of Menasha, in the county of Winnebago, are hereby authorized and empowered to appropriate the sum of twenty-five hundred dollars, heretofore raised by a tax upon the real estate of said village, under the provisions of "an act to authorize the village of Menasha to aid in the construction of railroads," approved March 24, 1860, to aid in the construction of the Chicago and Northwestern railway.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 78.

[Published March 10, 1862.]

AN ACT appointing a day for a tax sale in the village of Menasha.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. [That] the time for the sale of lots and real estate in the village of Menasha, in the county of Winnebago, for delinquent taxes for the year 1861, be and the same is hereby extended to the 20th day of March next, at which time it shall be lawful for said sale to be made, and when so made, shall be legal and valid as if the same had been made upon the day appointed by the charter of said village. The said sale shall be conducted as required by law.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
