

CHAPTER 21.

[Published February 5, 1863.]

AN ACT to legalize the official acts of Charles Church, as justice of the peace of the county of Winnebago, and to authorize him to file his official bond and oath of office.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. All the official acts and duties of Charles Church, as justice of the peace, in the county of Winnebago, in this state, prior to the passage of this act, so far as the same are consistent with the laws of this state, are hereby legalized and declared to be as valid, to all intents and purposes, as they would have been, had the said Charles Church filed his official bond and oath of office within the time and in the manner provided by the laws of this state. Acts legalized.

SECTION 2. It shall be lawful for the said Charles Church to file his official bond and oath of office as justice of the peace of the said county of Winnebago, pursuant to his election to said office, at the annual town meeting, held in the town of Vinland, in the said county of Winnebago, on the first day of April, A. D. 1862, at any time within thirty days after the passage of this act; and when said official bond and oath of office shall be so filed, in pursuance of the statute, the said Charles Church shall be fully qualified to act as justice of the peace of the town of Vinland, in the county of Winnebago, for the remainder of the term for which he was elected. Bond and oath may be filed, &c.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
