

CHAPTER 217.

[Published April 17, 1863.]

AN ACT authorizing the towns and villages of the county of Manitowoc to retain and dispose of license money.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. All moneys derived from licenses granted in the county of Manitowoc, under the provisions of chapter thirty-five of the revised statutes of this state, shall be paid into the treasuries of the several towns and villages of said county of Manitowoc, where such licenses are granted, and shall be appropriated and paid out as directed by the proper town board of supervisors, or village board of trustees.

To be paid into town treasuries—how appropriated.

SECTION 2. Section sixteen of chapter thirty-five of the revised statutes, shall not apply to the county of Manitowoc, after this act takes effect.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 218.

AN ACT to lay out a state road from Weelaunee, in Winnebago county, to Stevens Point, in Portage county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. R. W. Case, E. V. Graves and C. S. Murphey are hereby appointed commissioners to survey, lay out and establish a state road from a point in the town of Utica, near or at the Weelaunee postoffice, thence by the village of Omro, in Winnebago county, and Poysippi, in the county of Waushara, to Stevens Point, in the county of Portage.
