

CHAPTER 29.

[Published March 2, 1863.]

AN ACT to appropriate to A. P. Hodges, state prison commissioner, a certain sum of money therein named.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to A. P. Hodges, state prison commissioner, out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of ten thousand dollars, to pay part indebtedness, and the further sum of twenty thousand dollars, to defray the current expenses of the state prison for the year 1863. For current expenses.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 30.

[Published March 3, 1863.]

AN ACT to exempt from taxation the building known as the First Baptist church, in the city of Madison.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. The building known as the First Baptist church, in the city of Madison, Dane county, and the ground to such building belonging, shall not be liable to taxation for any purpose, in consequence of the occupancy of a portion thereof by the state historical society, so long as the rental paid by said society for the use of such portion, shall not exceed the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars per annum. Exemption.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
