AN ACT to authorize the Bank of Moneka to change its place of business.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

May remove place of business from Husti-ford to Portage city.

SECTION 1. The Bank of Moneka, located at Hustisford, in the county of Dodge, Wisconsin, is hereby authorized to remove its place of business from Hustisford, in the county of Dodge, to the city of Portage, in the county of Columbia, upon filing with the bank comptroller a certificate of the secretary of state, that said bank has complied with subdivision thirteen of an act to amend chapter four hundred and seventy-nine of the general laws of Wisconsin for the year 1852, entitled "an act to authorize the business of banking in the state of Wisconsin," approved May 15, 1858, and setting forth in said certificate the place to which said bank is to be removed: provided, that the holder or holders of any outstanding circulating notes of said bank may have such notes presented, and the payment thereof demanded, and may cause such notes to be protested for non-payment at Portage, in the same manner and with like effect as if the same had been so presented, demanded and protested at Hustisford.

Notes may be protested at? Portage.

SECTION 2. It shall not be lawful for the bank comptroller to issue to the said bank any circulating notes until its plates shall be so altered as to read, "Bank of Moneka. Portage," instead of "Bank of Moneka, Hustisford."

When notes to be issued to bank.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
