

CHAPTER 336.

[Published May 5, 1863.]

AN ACT to amend chapter ninety of the private and local laws of 1860, entitled "an act to incorporate the German mutual insurance company of Milwaukee."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

Limit to time for which money may be loaned, repealed.

SECTION 1. Section eighteen of chapter ninety of the private and local laws of 1860, entitled "an act to incorporate the German mutual insurance company of Milwaukee," is hereby amended, by striking out the words "for a term of time not exceeding one year," where it occurs [they occur] in the thirty-sixth line of said section; and further, by striking out the word "double," in the thirty-fourth line of said section, and inserting in lieu thereof "three times."

Amount of securities.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 337.

[Published May 4, 1863.]

AN ACT to amend an act entitled "an act to incorporate the Peshtigo lumbering and manufacturing company," approved October 11, 1856, and the amendments thereto.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

May issue preferred stock.

SECTION 1. That the "Peshtigo company" shall have the power, for the purpose of paying any debts or liabilities it may have incurred or hereafter [may] incur, the raising of moneys and [for] other purposes, to create and issue a preferred capital stock, in shares of one hundred dollars each, and to such aggregate amount as the board of directors of said company shall from time to time determine, and may establish pref-

ferences [preferences] in respect to dividends in favor of said stock, in such manner and to such extent and with such securities as it may deem expedient.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 340.

[Published May 6, 1863.]

AN ACT to incorporate the Fremont bridge company.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. That Henry J. Livermore, John S. Bartlett, John Bender, Ira Sumner, Malvin B. Patchin, Christopher C. Kinsman, Benjamin Brickley, and such persons as shall associate with them, be and they are hereby incorporated by the name and style of the "Fremont bridge company," and by such name may sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded, in any court in this state, and may have a common seal, and may change the same at pleasure.

Corporators.

Name and powers.

SECTION 2. Henry J. Livermore, Ira Sumner and Melvin B. Patchin are hereby appointed commissioners to receive subscriptions to the capital stock of said company, and shall open books of subscription at the store of Henry J. Livermore and the office of Ira Sumner, in the village of Fremont, Waupacca county, on the first Monday in April, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, which books shall be kept open for at least three days.

Commissioners to receive subscriptions.

SECTION 3. The capital stock of said company shall be four thousand dollars, and shall be divided into shares of twenty dollars each: *provided*, said company shall have power to increase the capital stock to any amount not exceeding eight thousand dollars.

SECTION 4. The said company shall have power to build and construct a bridge across the Wolf river in
