

have no authority or power to borrow money on bonds or other evidences of debt, unless the money so raised is to be expended on county buildings.

SECTION 8. All legislative and administrative power necessary to carry this act into full force and effect, is hereby conferred upon the county board of supervisors of Milwaukee county. Power conferred.

CHAPTER 14.

[Published February 4, 1864.]

AN ACT to authorize the town of Oxford, in the county of Marquette, to vote a tax for bounties to volunteers.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. A town meeting shall be held in and for the town of Oxford, in the county of Marquette, at the place of holding town meetings therein, on the thirteenth day of February, 1864, commencing at ten o'clock A. M., for the purpose of voting bounties to volunteers who have enlisted or who may hereafter enlist, to fill the quota of such town in the draft last ordered by the general government. Town meeting authorized.

SECTION 2. The qualified electors of such town, when assembled in pursuance of this act, may vote such bounties as they may deem proper, not exceeding one hundred and fifty dollars each, to such persons as have enlisted or who may hereafter enlist in pursuance of section one of this act, and may vote to raise by tax a sum of money sufficient to pay such bounties and interest thereon, at the rate of seven per cent. per annum, which tax shall be included in the next annual tax roll of such town, in a separate column, and be collected in the same manner as other town taxes are collected by law, and be paid out of the town treasury on the orders hereinafter mentioned. May vote bounties to volunteers, and tax to pay the same.

SECTION 3. The town board of supervisors shall draw orders on the treasurer of the town in favor of each person so enlisting, to the amount of the bounty voted at such town meeting, which orders shall draw Orders on treasurer.

interest at the rate of seven per cent. per annum from their date until their payment, and shall be delivered to such volunteer whenever he shall be accepted by the government, and duly credited to such town.

SECTION 4. Notices of the time, place and objects of such town meeting shall be posted up by the town clerk in four of the most public places in such town, at least six days previously to the time of holding the same.

SECTION 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 15.

[Published February 5, 1864.]

AN ACT to authorize the city of Beaver Dam to levy and collect a special tax to redeem certificates issued for bounty to volunteers.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Special tax au-
thorized.

SECTION 1. The common council of the city of Beaver Dam, in Dodge county, is hereby authorized to levy and collect a special tax, in addition to the amount authorized by the act incorporating said city, not exceeding four thousand dollars in amount; said tax to be levied and collected in the manner and at the time other taxes are levied and collected in said city.

How proceeds to
be used.

SECTION 2. The proceeds of the tax authorized by the preceding section, shall be used to redeem the scrip issued by the mayor, and signed by the mayor and clerk of said city, under its corporate seal, in the month of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, in pursuance of an ordinance duly enacted by the common council of said city, on the twenty-ninth day of December, 1863, authorizing the issuing of said scrip, for the purpose of raising money to enable said city to offer and pay a bounty to volunteers under the (then) new levy of United States troops, to enable said city to fill and furnish its quota of troops under said levy, without resorting to a draft.
