CHAPTER 25.

[Published February 11, 1864.]

AN ACT to legalize the acts of a certain town meeting held the 6th day of January A. D. 1864, in the town of Linden, Iowa county, Wisconsin, and the tax voted at such meeting.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Town meeting
and tax legalised

SECTION 1. The town meeting held in the town of Linden, Iowa county, Wisconsin, on the 6th day of January, A. D. 1864, for the purpose of raising money, by special tax, to pay town bounties to volunteers in the military service of the United States, is hereby declared legal and valid to all intents and purposes for which the same was held; and said tax shall be levied and collected with other town taxes for the year 1864, and in like manner: *provided*, that the board of supervisors of said town may, by an order, specify any earlier date for the collection of such tax, and direct said collection to be made in the same manner as other taxes.

Who may sign
orders

SECTION 2. Either of the town supervisors of said town and the town clerk thereof, may sign and issue any and all papers, instruments in writing, certificates or orders which shall or may be necessary or expedient in order to carry into effect the purposes for which said town meeting was held, and the same shall be valid and binding on said town.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
