

CHAPTER 465.

[Published May 7, 1864.]

AN ACT to legalize certain town orders issued by the board of supervisors of the town of Kewaunee, in the county of Kewaunee.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. The acts and proceedings of the board of supervisors of the town of Kewaunee, in the county of Kewaunee, in January, 1864, in issuing town orders for the payment of bounties to volunteers credited or to be credited upon the quota or quotas of said town of Kewaunee, are hereby legalized and declared valid for all purposes whatever ; and the town orders so issued are and each of them is hereby declared to be a legal and valid claim against said town of Kewaunee, and shall be paid in the same manner as other town orders are paid. Orders for bounties to volunteers legalized.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 466.

[Published May 7, 1864.]

AN ACT to annex a part of the county of Douglas to the county of Burnett.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. All of towns numbers forty-one and forty-two, of ranges numbers ten and eleven west, in the county of Douglas, are hereby detached and set off from the county of Douglas, and annexed and attached to the county of Burnett. Townships detached from Douglas and annexed to Burnett.

SECTION 2. All acts and parts of acts conflicting with the provisions of this act, are hereby repealed. Repeal.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
