

CHAPTER 810.

AN ACT to legalize the proceedings of the town of Leeds, in Columbia county, in raising by tax bounties to be paid to volunteers.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Bounty tax proceedings legalized.

SECTION 1. The town meetings of the town of Leeds, in the county of Columbia, held for the purpose of voting to raise by tax extra bounties to be paid to volunteers into the military service of this state or of the United States, and all the votes, acts and resolves of said meetings, or any of them, concerning the offering, pledging and voting to raise such bounty money, are hereby declared legal, valid and binding in the law, the same and as fully as if the said meeting or meetings had been notified and conducted in all respects in accordance with the provisions of law then in force relating to that subject.

Town orders legalized.

SECTION 2. All the official acts of the supervisors of the said town of Leeds done, and performance of the electors of said town, to raise money to pay such extra bounty to volunteers, are also hereby declared valid and binding in the law; and all the town orders signed by the chairman of the board of supervisors of said town, and countersigned by the town clerk of said town, payable out of the volunteer bounty fund of said town, are hereby declared valid and binding in the law, the same as if the law had been strictly complied with in auditing the claims for which they were issued, and in issuing the same.

SECTION 3. This act shall be in force from and after its passage and publication.
