

CHAPTER 479.

[Published May 31, 1865.]

AN ACT to provide for the expenditure of certain town money in the town of Saukville, for repairing and building highways and bridges in said town.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. All moneys now in the hands of the treasurer of the town of Saukville, in the county of Ozaukee, which have been paid to such treasurer for licenses to sell spirituous or intoxicating liquors or drinks, shall be expended by the supervisors of said town for the purpose of repairing and building roads and bridges in said town, any provision of law to the contrary notwithstanding.

To be expended on roads and bridges.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 480.

[Published June 2, 1865.]

AN ACT to legalize the acts of a special election held on the 13th day of August, A. D. 1864, in the town of Eagle, Waukesha county, Wis., and authorize the collection of the tax voted at said election.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The special election held in the town of Eagle, Waukesha county, Wisconsin, on the 13th day of August, A. D. 1864, for the purpose of raising a tax to pay bounties to volunteers enlisting and who were credited to said town, is hereby declared legal and valid for all the purposes for which the same was held; and all acts done in pursuance of the vote of said election, by the officers of said town, or any of them, are hereby declared valid, the same as if the law had been fully complied with in conducting said election.
