

SECTION 8. The architect employed under this act, is prohibited from receiving, directly or indirectly, any commission, bonus, reward or compensation from the contractor or contractors who may construct the work contemplated by this act, or of any part thereof, or from any one in the employ of or furnishing materials to such contractor or contractors. Architect to receive no bonus.

SECTION 9. In case of a violation of the foregoing section, the architect shall be discharged, and shall forfeit all claim and right to compensation for services rendered up to the time of such discharge. Forfeiture.

SECTION 10. The commissioners shall accept no bid for heating apparatus which in their opinion will not fully accomplish the object sought to be obtained by this act, and they may require such security as they may deem advisable for the faithful performance of the contract. Security for performance of heating apparatus.

SECTION 11. This act shall not be construed as to permit the commissioners to let the contracts herein authorized, for a larger sum than one hundred and ten thousand dollars, payable as provided by this act. Construction.

SECTION 12. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 60.

[Published April 13, 1866.]

AN ACT to provide for registering the names of persons who have heretofore declared or may hereafter declare their intentions to become citizens of the United States of America.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. The clerks of the circuit courts in the several counties of this state, are hereby authorized and required to make out an alphabetical register, from the files of their several offices, in a suitable book to be provided for that purpose, of the names of all persons who have heretofore declared their intentions to become citizens of the United States of America, together with Clerks of courts to make out alphabetical lists.

the date of the making of such declaration; and it shall be the duty of such clerks to register in such book, in like manner, the names of all persons who may hereafter make such declaration.

Compensation.

SECTION 2. Such clerks shall be entitled to receive from their several counties, as compensation for making such register, three (3) cents for every name so registered, where the declaration was made before the time of the passage of this act, and ten (10) cents for every name thereafter registered, as required by section one of this act.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 61.

[Published April 14, 1866.]

AN ACT to amend section 3 of chapter 43 of the revised statutes, in relation to strays.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

How notice may be given, if owner is unknown.

SECTION 1. Section three of chapter forty-three of the revised statutes, is hereby amended, so as to read as follows: "Section 3. If the owner of any stray be unknown, the finder shall, within ten days after taking up the same, file a notice thereof with the town clerk of the town, and if the stray or strays so taken up are of the value of less than five dollars, he shall also post up notices of the taking up of such stray, in two or more public places in such town; but if the stray or strays so taken up are of the value of more than five dollars, he shall cause such notice to be published for four weeks successively in some newspaper printed in the county in which he resides, unless there shall be one printed still nearer his place of residence, in an adjoining county, in which case he may publish it in either paper, at his option; and in case there shall be no newspaper printed within twenty miles of the residence of the finder of such stray or strays, he shall

Notice may be published in another county.
