

CHAPTER 42.

[Published April 1, 1867.]

AN ACT to amend chapter 22 of the general laws of 1866, entitled "an act relating to the organization of manufacturing companies in this state."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. Section one of chapter 22 of general laws of 1866 is hereby amended, by inserting in the second line of said section, after the word "on," the words "mining or." Sec. 1 amended.

SECTION 2. The second section of said chapter 22 is hereby amended, by inserting after the word "which," in the fourth line of said section, the following words, to wit: "together with all the other books of said corporation." Sec. 2 amended.

SECTION 3. All acts or parts of acts heretofore granted to any mining or manufacturing company, inconsistent with the provisions of this chapter, are hereby repealed. Repealed.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 43.

[Published April 1, 1867.]

AN ACT to amend section eighteen (18) of chapter one hundred and sixty-five (165) of the revised statutes, entitled "of offenses against property."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. Section eighteen (18) of chapter one hundred and sixty-five (165) of the revised statutes is hereby amended, by inserting after the word "jail," in said section eighteen (18,) the words "or imprisonment in the house of correction of any county in this state." Amended.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 44.

[Published April 1, 1867.]

AN ACT to provide for the publication of the laws of the territory of Wisconsin, for the years 1836, 1837 and 1838.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

Laws of 1836, 1837 and 1838 to be published. SECTION 1. The secretary of state is hereby authorized to cause to be published six hundred copies of the laws of the territory of Wisconsin, which were passed and enacted in the years 1836, 1837 and 1838.

In what manner to be printed and bound, &c. SECTION 2. The said laws shall be printed and bound in the same manner as the volume of general laws for this state passed at the present session of the legislature, and shall be included in one volume. The secretary of state shall annex to said volume of laws his printed certificate, stating that the laws published in said book have been compared with the laws of said years 1836, 1837 and 1838, as the same appear in the printed laws for said years, and the same may be read and shall be received in all courts and places with the same effect as the printed statutes for said years heretofore published.

Distribution of certain copies. SECTION 3. The secretary of state shall deliver one copy of said laws when published, to each of the officers hereinafter named: The judges of the supreme [and] circuit courts, the governor and secretary of state, attorney general, and to each of the clerks of the circuit courts in this state, and the officers so receiving the same shall deliver the same to their successors in office. One hundred copies thereof shall be retained in the office of the secretary of state. The balance of said six hundred copies may be disposed of by the secretary of state at private sale, at such price per volume as may be fixed upon by the governor and secretary of state: *provided, however, that not more than*
