

criminal cases, when the court may, in its discretion, order such transcript to be made, audited, certified and paid for in the same manner as the reporter's per diem compensation. In such case the reporter's notes shall be written out in full, and filed with the clerk of the court.

Judge may remove reporters.

SECTION 4. The judge of said court may, in his discretion, remove such reporters, or either of them, and may fill any vacancy caused by such removal, or from any other cause.

SECTION 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 27.

[Published February 24, 1868.]

AN ACT authorizing the board of supervisors to exempt any county from the provisions of chapter 404 of the general laws of 1862, relative to the license and keeping of dogs.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

County board may exempt owners of dogs from taxation thereon.

SECTION 1. That the county board of supervisors in each county may, at the annual session of such board, exempt such county from the provisions of chapter 404 of the general laws of 1862, and all acts amendatory thereto, entitled "an act to regulate the license and keeping of dogs."

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
