

CHAPTER 99.

AN ACT to amend chapter 167 of the general laws of 1867, entitled "an act to amend chapter 15 of the revised statutes, so far as it relates to permanent landmarks."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section two (2) of chapter 167 of the general laws of 1867, entitled "an act to amend chapter fifteen (15) of the revised statutes, so far as it relates to permanent landmarks," is hereby amended so as to read as follows: "Section 2. Whenever a majority of all the votes cast at such election shall be in favor of the erection of permanent landmarks, it shall be the duty of the supervisors of such town to procure at the expense of said town, a sufficient number of monuments of stone or some other durable material, not less than three feet in length and six inches in diameter, and to make a contract with the county surveyor or any competent surveyor, for the survey of all the sections of said town, and for the erection of said monuments, one at each section corner, and one at each external quarter section in said town; said monuments to be set two and a half feet in the ground, except in cases where they shall be set in the center of highways, and in that case the top shall be even with or below the surface of the ground; and such monuments as shall be set at the corner of sections, shall have engraved upon them, in cyphers the number of each section for which such monument forms a landmark, and those which shall be set for quarter posts, shall have engraved on them ' $\frac{1}{4}$ S.'"

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
