

CHAPTER 120.

[Published March 24, 1870.]

AN ACT to define the meaning of the word, "supplies," as used in section one of chapter 100 of the general laws of 1867, entitled "an act to amend section one of chapter 66 of the general laws relating to liens for labor and services upon logs and lumber in certain counties."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The word, "supplies" wherever the same is used in an act to amend section one of chapter 66 of the general laws of 1866, entitled "an act to amend chapter 517 of the general laws of 1865, entitled 'an act to amend section one of chapter 154 of the general laws of 1862, entitled 'an act providing for a lien for labor and services upon logs and lumber in certain counties,'" shall be construed in all courts and places to mean, feed used for teams, and the food necessarily used in camp to support the men, and no other thing. Meaning of word "supplies."

SECTION 2. Section one of said chapter 100 is further amended by inserting the word, "Waupaca" between the words, "Wood and Manitowoc" where they occur in said section, so that part of the section shall read, "counties of Pierce, St. Croix, Polk, Dallas, La Crosse, Marathon, Portage, Wood, Waupaca, Manitowoc, Shawano, Door, Kewaunee, Oconto and Brown." Further amended.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
