

CHAPTER 81.

[Published March 21, 1870.]

AN ACT to amend section 1, chapter 165 of the general laws of 1869, repealing so much of the provisions of chapter 484 of the private laws of 1868, entitled "an act to incorporate the State Firemen's Association of Wisconsin, organized September 24, 1863," as exempts individual property from taxation.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 1 of chapter 165 of the general laws of 1869, is hereby amended so as to read as follows, after the words, "*provided, however*": the common council of any city and the trustees of any incorporated village in the state, in which there shall be a fire engine or engines owned by such city or incorporated village, shall annually appropriate or pay to each active fireman belonging to any fire or hook and ladder company organized by authority of such city or incorporation, such sum as such common council or board of trustees, as the case may be, shall deem a reasonable compensation for the services of such firemen. SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 82.

[Published March 21, 1870.]

AN ACT relating to the preservation of the colors and flags of our late regiments.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The quartermaster general of the state is hereby authorized and required to procure suitable Preservation of
flags.

cases in which to store and preserve the colors and flags of our various regiments, batteries and detachments having such colors or flags, engaged in the late war: *provided*, that the cost of such cases shall not exceed the sum of four hundred and fifty dollars.

How placed.

SECTION 2. The cases shall have glass fronts and of sufficient size to receive all such colors or flags, placing them therein so that they can all be labeled, and when so labeled, seen with the labels from the outside, and without opening the cases.

Shall be labelled.

SECTION 3. The label shall be placed in a conspicuous place on the colors or flags, and shall state the number of the regiment, and also, briefly, the battles, sieges and campaigns in which the regiment, battery or detachment was engaged.

Quartermaster to certify to expense.

SECTION 4. The quartermaster general shall certify the correctness of all expenditures incurred under the provisions of this act, and when the same is approved by the governor, file such certificate in the office of the secretary of state, and thereupon the secretary of state shall issue his warrant upon the state treasurer for the amount so certified and approved in favor of the parties to whom the same may be due.

Appropriation.

SECTION 5. There is hereby appropriated, out of the general fund, a sum sufficient to meet the requirements of this act.

SECTION 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
