

CHAPTER 10.

[Published February 14, 1871.]

AN ACT to amend section 1 of chapter 78 of the general laws of 1859, entitled "an act to change the name of the House of Refuge to that of the State Reform School," and to change the name of the State Reform School to the Industrial School for Boys.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. Section one of chapter 78 of the general laws of 1859 is hereby amended so as to read as follows: Section 1. The name of the House of Refuge of this state, located at Waukesha, is hereby changed to that of "the Wisconsin Industrial School for Boys," by which latter name it shall hereafter be known in all courts, places and appropriations. Amended.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 11.

[Published February 15, 1871.]

AN ACT to provide for the apportionment of school moneys in certain cases.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. The boards of supervisors of those towns which have not raised by order of the county board of supervisors a sum sufficient to entitle them to an apportionment of school moneys for the year 1871, are hereby authorized to transfer from the general fund to the school fund of their respective towns, the amounts in which said towns are deficient; and upon the receipt by the state superintendent of public instruction of the certificate of any town clerk that the

May transfer moneys from general to school fund.

requisite amount has been thus transferred, he shall apportion to said towns the full sum of school moneys to which such towns would have been entitled, provided the county boards had levied upon such town the amounts required by law.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 12.

[Published February 15, 1871.]

AN ACT to amend chapter 139 of the general laws of 1867, entitled "an act to reduce the price of swamp and overflowed lands in certain cases."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Amended.

SECTION 1. All the lands mentioned in section one of chapter 139 of the general laws of 1867, the price of which has been reduced by section three of said chapter, are hereby restored to, and shall be held for sale at the minimum price of one dollar and twenty-five cents per acre, with the amount of unpaid taxes added thereto.

SECTION 2. Section three of said chapter 139 is hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
