CHAPTER 111.

[Published March 30, 1871.]

AN ACT to repeal section 11 of chapter 8 of the general laws of 1870, entitled "an act to amend chapter 361 of the general laws of 1860, entitled 'an act conferring jurisdiction on the county court of Winnebago county,'" and to restore section 23 of chapter 361 of the general laws of 1860.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 11 of chapter 8 of the general laws of 1870 is hereby repealed, and section 23 of chapter 361 of the general laws of 1860, is hereby revived and restored, and made of full force and effect. Repealed.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 112.

AN ACT to amend chapter 16 of the general laws of 1870, entitled "an act to authorize the appointment of phonographic reporters for the circuit court for the counties of Green Lake and Dodge, in the third judicial circuit."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section three of chapter sixteen of the general laws of 1870 is hereby amended by striking Amended.

SECTION 2. All other acts or parts of acts conflicting with this act, are hereby repealed.

CHAPTER 113.

[Published April 11, 1871.]

AN ACT to amend chapter 56 of the general laws of 1869, entitled "an act to authorize the appointment of a phonographic reporter in the tenth judicial circuit of the state of Wisconsin."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

Sec. 3 amended. SECTION 1. Section three, of chapter fifty-six of the general laws of 1869, is hereby amended by striking out the word, "seven," where it occurs in said section, and inserting in lieu thereof the word, "ten."

Sec. 10 amended. SECTION 2. Section ten of chapter fifty-six, as aforesaid, is hereby amended so as to read as follows :
 "In the trial of criminal cases the court may, in its discretion, order a transcript of the evidence and proceedings to be made, certified and audited and paid for in the same manner as the per diem compensation of such reporter, and in such cases the reporter's notes shall be written out in full and filed with the clerk of the court."

SECTION 3. All other acts or parts of acts conflicting with this act are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
