

CHAPTER 32.

[Published March 4, 1871.]

AN ACT to amend section 8 of chapter 137 of the revised statutes entitled "of evidence."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Amended.

SECTION 1. Section 8 of chapter 137 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding at the end of said section the following: "or if said witness shall be a member of the legislature of the state of Wisconsin, and said legislature shall be in session during the term of the court in which said member shall be required as a witness, or if said member shall be a member of any legislative committee, which committee shall by law be required to be in session during the recess of said legislature, his deposition may be taken as hereinafter provided: *provided*, said member shall voluntarily waive his privileges as secured to him by law."

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 33.

AN ACT to amend section 20, chapter 180, general laws of 1868, entitled "an act to provide for the assessment of property for taxation and the levy of taxes thereon."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Amended.

SECTION 1. Section 20 of chapter 180 of the general laws of 1868, entitled "an act to provide for the assessment of property for taxation and the levy of taxes

thereon," is hereby amended by adding in the fifth line of said section, after the word, "located," the words, "*provided*, that the temporary removal thereof to some other town or ward shall not release the same from assessment under this section."

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 34.

AN ACT relating to the manner of commencing civil actions, and to repeal chapter 68 of the general laws of 1869, entitled "an act relating to the manner of commencing civil actions, and amendatory of section 9 of chapter 124 of the revised statutes."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. Chapter 68 of the general laws of this state for the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, entitled "an act relating to the manner of commencing civil actions, and amendatory of chapter 124 of the revised statutes," is hereby repealed. Repealed.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
