

number of shares of its property owned by the members to whom any such certificate is issued. Such certificates shall be signed by its president and secretary, and shall be transferable; and any member of any such society, who shall sell and transfer all his shares and interest in the property of such society, shall from thenceforth cease to be a member thereof."

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 46.

[Published March 6, 1871.]

AN ACT to provide for the payment of the state agent for the settlement of war claims against the United States.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Claim of W. W. Tredway to be paid.

SECTION 1. The treasurer shall pay upon the warrant of the secretary of state to William W. Tredway for his services in seeking and procuring the settlement of war claims at the United States treasury, such sum as the governor, secretary of state and the attorney general shall certify to be reasonable and just, not exceeding the sum of twenty-seven hundred and twenty-four dollars, and the same to be in full of all the services heretofore performed by the said William W. Tredway for that object, and in full of all service in relation to any and all war claims against the United States treasury.

SECTION 2. There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, a sum sufficient to carry this act into effect.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
