

CHAPTER 59.

[Published March 10, 1871.]

AN ACT to amend section 31 of chapter 184 of the revised statutes, entitled "of executions and proceedings supplementary thereto."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Amended.

SECTION 1. Section thirty-one of chapter one hundred and thirty-four of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto the following: 11. The property hereinbefore mentioned shall not be exempt from attachment or execution issued upon a judgment in an action for the purchase money of the same property.

SECTION 2. This act shall be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 60.

[Published March 10, 1871.]

AN ACT to authorize the state librarian to exchange supreme court reports for other law books for the use of the state library.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

May exchange reports for other books.

SECTION 1. The state librarian is hereby authorized to exchange Wisconsin supreme court reports for other law books, or books that may be needed for the state library, or sell said reports and purchase with the proceeds thereof such books as the said library may stand in need of: *provided*, that no series of the supreme court reports shall be reduced by such sale or exchange below one hundred copies, and only the re-

ports below the twentieth volume shall be sold or exchanged.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 61.

Published March 11, 1871.]

AN ACT to provide for the appointment of phonographic reporters in the counties of Sheboygan and Manitowoc.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. It shall be lawful for the judge of the circuit court for the fourth judicial district [circuit] to appoint one or more phonographic reporters for said court in the counties of Sheboygan and Manitowoc, who shall be a sworn officer of said court, and shall be skilled in the art of short hand reporting, one of whom shall attend upon the said court at each term thereof when required by such court or the judge thereof so to do, and shall discharge such duties as the judge may direct.

May appoint phonographic reporter.

SECTION 2. The phonographic reporter shall be allowed such daily compensation as shall be fixed by the judge of the court, not exceeding ten dollars per day for each days' attendance upon such court when required by the judge thereof to attend, which shall be certified, audited and paid in like manner as is provided by law for the payment of the sheriff for attendance upon the courts: *provided*, that but one such reporter shall be employed at the same time.

His compensation.

SECTION 3. In addition to the above compensation, the reporter shall be allowed as fees a price per folio to be fixed by the court, for making and furnishing transcripts of his short hand notes of the testimony or other proceedings of the court in the trial of any action, and the charges for such transcripts, when made shall be
