

CHAPTER 328.

[Published March 24, 1874.]

AN ACT for the relief of the estates of deceased persons.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. In any case where any land has been or may hereafter be forfeited to the state by reason of the non-payment of principal, interest or taxes due the state thereon, and such land has been resold by the state, the commissioners of school and university lands may at any time within ninety days from the time when such land may have been so resold and before any patent has been issued for the same, revoke such certificates of sale in all cases when it shall be made to appear to their satisfaction that said land has valuable improvements thereon, and that such default and forfeiture was occasioned by the death of the holder of the first certificates of sale, or the neglect of the administrator in settling the estate of such debtor, upon the payment of the amount which was actually due on such lands at the date of such re-sale, together with the legal costs and charges, and in all such cases the money paid by the person to whom such land was so re-sold, shall be returned by the said commissioners to the person paying the same.

Commissioners may revoke sale in case owner is deceased.

Administration to pay costs.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 329.

[Published March 25, 1874.]

AN ACT for the preservation of game in the state of Wisconsin.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. No person shall catch, kill or otherwise destroy, or have in his or her possession, or exposed for sale, any woodcock in this state, between the fifteenth day of November and the succeeding fourth day of July

Killing of game prohibited from Nov 15th to succeeding 4th day of July also from Nov 15th
