## CHAPTER 11.

[Published February 15, 1875.]

AN ACT to amend sections 1 and 3, of chapter 148, of the laws of 1874, entitled, "an act for the preservation of fish in Waukesha and Walworth counties."

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows;*

SECTION 1. Section 1, of chapter 148, of the laws of 1874, is hereby amended to read as follows: "Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to kill, destroy, catch or take, in any way or manner, or pursue with intent to kill, destroy, catch or take, in any way or manner, any pickerel, mascanonge, mascalonge, pike, pike perch, black bass, growler or silver bass, in any of the rivers or lakes in the counties of Waukesha and Walworth, between the first day of March and the thirtieth day of April, in any year." Prohibiting taking or destruction of fish.

SECTION 2. Section three, of said act is hereby amended to read as follows: "Section three. Any person or persons who shall molest, disturb or destroy any pickerel, mascanonge, mascalonge, pike, pike perch, black bass, growler or silver bass, at the time of their spawning, or disturb, or destroy their spawning beds or nests, between the first day of March and the thirtieth day of April, of each year, shall upon conviction thereof be subject to, and liable for a penalty of not less than five dollars, nor more than fifteen dollars, for every such act committed in said counties of Waukesha and Walworth, together with the costs of prosecution." Penalty.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
