

## CHAPTER 241.

[Published March 15, 1875.]

AN ACT authorizing the Governor to procure maps, plats, and lists of the lands granted to the state of Wisconsin, to aid in the construction of railroads, by the acts of Congress approved June 3, 1856, and May 5, 1864.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

Governor to procure maps, plats and lists of lands granted to state by congress.

SECTION 1. The Governor is hereby authorized and directed to procure from the United States such full and complete maps, plats and lists of the lands granted to the state of Wisconsin to aid in the construction of railroads, by acts of Congress approved June 3, 1856, and May 5, 1864, as will show what sections and parts of sections have been reserved from sale by the general government under said acts, to be approved to the state for the purpose aforesaid.

Appropriation so defray expenses.

SECTION 2. There is hereby appropriated out of the fund derived from trespass on said lands, a sufficient sum, not exceeding five hundred dollars (\$500.00), to pay all expenses incurred under this act; and the secretary of state is hereby directed to draw his warrant on said fund for the amount of said expenses upon the presentation to him of an itemized account thereof, approved by the Governor.

SECTION 3. This act shall be in force from and after its passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 242.

[Published March 15, 1875.]

AN ACT to establish lumber-district number eleven (11) in the state of Wisconsin.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

Organization of lumber district No. 11.

SECTION 1. For the purpose of inspecting and regulating the survey and measurement of logs, timber and lumber in this state, the counties of Ashland

and Bayfield, and towns number thirty-nine (39) and 40 north, of range one (1) east, in Chippewa county, are hereby constituted and created a lumber district, to be known and called lumber district number eleven (11).

SECTION 2. Said lumber district number eleven (11) shall be subject to the provisions of chapter one hundred and sixty-seven (167), of the general laws of 1864, entitled, "An act to establish lumber districts in this state, and to regulate the traffic in logs, timber and lumber in said districts;" and also to the provisions of chapter fifty-seven (57), of the general laws of 1866, amending said chapter one hundred and sixty-seven (167), of the general laws of 1864.

District to be subject to chap-167, (G. L. 1864.

SECTION 3. The inspector of said lumber district number eleven (11) shall keep his office at the village of Ashland, in the county of Ashland and state of Wisconsin.

Inspector to keep office at Ashland.

SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby repealed, and this act shall take effect and be in force from and after the passage and publication thereof.

Conflicting acts repealed.

## CHAPTER 243.

[Published March 25, 1875.]

AN ACT to vacate the cemetery located in the third ward of the city of Madison, and to provide for the removal of the dead buried therein, to the Forest Hill Cemetery, owned by said city.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. That the plat of the cemetery located upon block one hundred and eighty in the city of Madison, is hereby vacated, and it shall be unlawful hereafter to use said cemetery or any lot or part of lot therein for the purpose of burying the dead therein, and it shall be lawful for the city of Madison to sell and convey the same or make such other use or disposition of said cemetery grounds, after the removal from the same of the dead buried therein, as hereinafter provided, as the common council of said city may designate or appoint.

Cemetery plat vacated.
