

CHAPTER 255.

[Published March 25, 1875.]

AN ACT to appropriate to Carl Busack a sum of money therein named.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of twenty-six hundred and twenty-eight dollars (\$2,628) to Carl Busack, in full settlement and payment of all claims and demands, actions and causes of action, of every kind and nature whatsoever, legal or equitable, arising from or growing out of his contract for work, labor and services, and materials in and about building and constructing the wings to the Wisconsin Institution for the Education of the Blind, and for all extra work, labor, services and materials that he furnished, performed, bestowed or incurred in or about the erection or construction of the said wings, and for all extra charges and expenses made or incurred by him in or about the same.

SECTION 2. The secretary of state shall, on the application of the said Carl Busack, draw his warrant for the said sum and deliver the same to the said Carl Busack, and his acceptance of the same shall completely and fully release and discharge the state from all the claims, demands, matters and things mentioned in section one (1), of this act, and shall be a full and complete bar in all courts and places to any suit, action or proceedings for or in behalf of the said Carl Busack for the recovery of the claims or demands mentioned herein, or any part thereof.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
