

ceeds of which shall be covered into the fund from which taken.

SECTION 5. It shall be the duty of the governor and attorney-general, at least once in each quarter year, and at such other times as the governor may elect, to examine and see that the sum of all moneys, appearing by the books of the secretary of state and state treasurer as belonging to the several funds, is in the vaults of the treasury; and in case of a deficiency, to require the treasurer to make the same at once good. Should the treasurer refuse or neglect for the period of ten days thereafter to have the full sum due in the treasury, it shall be the duty of the attorney-general to institute proceeding at law to recover the same.

Duty of governor and attorney-general to see that money is in treasury.

SECTION 6. Sections one and two, of this act, shall apply to all public officers within this state, and for any violation of the provisions thereof suit may be instituted by any tax-payer, as in other criminal proceedings.

Application of sections one and two.

SECTION 7. Nothing contained in this act shall be construed as prohibiting the investment of funds by any county, town, city or village authorities in the outstanding indebtedness of their own respective organizations.

Construction of act.

SECTION 8. All acts or parts of acts conflicting with or contravening the provisions of this act, are hereby repealed.

Repealed.

SECTION 9. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after the first Monday in January, 1878.

CHAPTER 341.

[Published April 7, 1876.]

AN ACT to establish the salaries of the state officers.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The attorney general shall receive a salary of three thousand dollars per annum, which shall be in full for all services rendered by him in his official capacity, including his services as commissioner of school and university lands; which shall be paid out

of the treasury of the state in monthly payments, and all fees and perquisites received by him shall be paid into the state treasury and become a part of the general fund.

Salary of secretary of state. SECTION 2. The secretary of state shall receive a salary of five thousand dollars per annum, which shall be in full for all services rendered by him in his official capacity, including his services as commissioner of school and university lands, and all fees received by him as commissioner of insurance, which shall be paid out of the treasury of the state in monthly payments, and all fees and perquisites received by him shall be paid into the state treasury, and become a part of the general fund.

Salary of state treasurer. SECTION 3. The state treasurer shall receive a salary of five thousand dollars per annum, which shall be in full for all services rendered by him in his official capacity, including his services as commissioner of school and university lands, which shall be paid out of the treasury of the state in monthly payments. All fees and perquisites received by him from every source shall be paid into the state treasury and become a part of the general fund.

Officers to make detailed statements of fees and perquisites. SECTION 4. It is hereby made the duty of the several officers named in this act, on or before the first day of August in each year, to make out and furnish to the secretary of state a detailed statement of the fees and perquisites, if any, received by each in his official capacity during the preceding year, and what disposition has been made of the same; and it is hereby made the duty of the secretary of state to include such detailed statement annually in his report to the governor of this state.

Appropriation. SECTION 5. There is hereby annually appropriated from the general fund a sum of money sufficient to carry into effect the provisions of this act.

Repealed. SECTION 6. All acts and parts of acts in conflict with the provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

When act to take effect. SECTION 7. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after the first Monday in January, A. D. 1878.
