LAWS OF WISCONSIN.

[No. 1, S.]

CHAPTER 1.

AN ACT to amend section one hundred and thirteen, chapter ten, of the revised statutes of 1878, to furnish stationery to the chief clerk and sergeant-at-arms of the senate and assembly, to an amount necessary to the discharge of their several duties.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section one hundred and thirteen of chapter ten of revised statutes of 1878, is hereby amended by inserting in said section after the word "value," in the fourth line of said section, the following: "Also, sufficient stationery to the chief clerk and sergeant-at-arms of the senate and assembly, to an amount necessary to the discharge of their several duties," so that said section one hundred and thirteen of chapter ten of the revised statutes of 1878, shall read as follows: Section 113. The superintendent of public property shall furnish annually stationery as follows: To the lieutenant governor, each member of the legislature, chief clerk, and sergeant-at-arms, not exceeding thirty dollars in value; also sufficient stationery to the chief clerk and sergeant-at-arms of the senate and assembly to an amount necessary to the discharge of their several duties. To one reporter for each of the daily newspapers publishing the proceedings of the legislature, twenty dollars in value; such stationery to be furnished to such reporters only upon the certificate of the publishers of such newspapers that they have employed the person named in such certificate as reporter for the entire session of the legislature, and that they will publish in their papers the daily proceedings of the legislature, with the indorsement thereon of the presiding officer of the house in which such reporter is engaged, that he is present and discharging his duties. But one person shall be entitled to draw stationery as reporter of any news-

paper, and no person shall draw stationery from more than one branch of the legislature; and such superintendent shall issue to the several standing committees of the legislature, upon the written request of the chairman thereof, the necessary amount of stationery, not exceeding five dollars in value, to each such committee.

SECTION 2. This act shall be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 2.

AN ACT to legalize the action therein set forth of the board of supervisors of the town of Arena, in the county of Iowa.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The action of the board of supervisors of the town of Arena, in the county of Iowa, at a special meeting, held on the fourth day of December, A. D. 1878, in correcting certain unauthorized changes in the assessment roll of said town, which were made after said roll had been acted upon by the board of review of said town, is hereby legalized, and the said assessment roll, so corrected as aforesaid, and the tax roll based thereon, are hereby declared to be the legal assessment roll and the legal tax roll of said town of Arena, for the year aforesaid; and as such, shall be received as evidence in all courts and places in this state; and no evidence to impeach the same, by reason of such correction, shall be received.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
