

of the court where the special term is held shall transmit all orders, judgments and other papers to the clerk of the circuit court of the county where said causes or matters are pending. The said papers shall be filed and entered by such clerk in the same manner as if said cause or matters had been heard or determined by the circuit court at a term thereof held in that county, and all orders, proceedings and judgments made in pursuance of this act shall have the like force and effect as if made in the county where such cause or matters are or may be pending, and no notice of the holding of such special term shall be required, other than the passage and publication of the act.

SECTION 3. All writs, indictments, summons, recognizances, processes, informations, motions, and other proceedings in any of said court, and all jurors summoned to attend, and all notices of trial, and every and all proceedings pending, or to be heard on the days heretofore fixed as the first day of said courts, shall be held returnable, cited to appear and noticed for hearing on the days herein fixed for the first day of said several courts, and shall be heard and disposed of as if noticed for hearing on the days herein fixed. Writs and processes.

SECTION 4. All acts or parts of acts conflicting with this act are hereby repealed, so far as they conflict with this act. Repealed.

SECTION 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, except so far as it applies to the county of Barron, and it shall be in force and effect as to the county of Barron from and after the first day of May, 1879. Barron county.

CHAPTER 182.

AN ACT to protect and preserve fish in lakes Winnebago, Little Butte des Morts, Butte des Morts, Winneconne, Poygan, Apuckaway, Buffalo, and the waters of the upper and lower Fox river, including all streams, creeks, sloughs, bayous or marshes or waters adjacent, or tributary thereto.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. No person or persons shall catch or take any fish in or from any of the waters of lakes Winnebago, Little Lake des Morts, Butte des Morts, Taking of fish prohibited.

Winneconne, Poygan, Apuckaway, Buffalo, or the upper and lower Fox river, including all streams, bayous, marshes or waters adjacent or tributary thereto, with any device for taking or catching fish, excepting spears or hooks and lines and minnow nets.

Use of nets unlawful.

SECTION 2. No person shall set, place or draw any net (excepting minnow nets) in any of the waters above described and mentioned.

Penalty for violation.

SECTION 3. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this act shall be deemed guilty of misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall forfeit and pay for each and every such offense a penalty of not less than fifty dollars, nor more than one hundred dollars, in the discretion of the court, and costs, and shall stand committed to the common jail where such offense was committed, there to remain until such fine and costs are paid, or until discharged by due course of law; said penalty shall be recovered in a criminal action in the name of the state of Wisconsin, before a justice of the peace having jurisdiction over the place where the offense was committed, and when collected, one-half of such penalty shall be paid to the person making the complaint, and the remainder of said penalty shall be paid into the county treasury according to law.

Repealed.

SECTION 4. All acts or parts of acts contravening the provisions of this act, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 183.

AN ACT to further protect life and limb.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Boys to keep off trains.

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any boy under the age of seventeen years, in this state, to attempt to get upon, to cling to, or to jump or step from, any railroad car or train, while the same is in motion: *provided, however,* that nothing in this act shall be construed to apply to employes of any railway company.

Penalty for violation.

SECTION 2. Any violation of this act shall be a misdemeanor, and shall be punished by fine of not less than two nor more than twenty dollars.
