CHAPTER 66.

AN ACT to repeal chapter fifty-three, private and local laws of 1872, entitled an act to provide for county printing for the county of Waupaca, and chapter ninety-nine, laws of 1876, amendatory thereof.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter fifty-three, of private and local laws of 1872, and chapter ninety-nine, laws of 1876, amendatory thereof, are hereby repealed.

CHAPTER 67.

AN ACT to provide for the election of justices of the peace in the city of Watertown.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Boundaries of districts.

SECTION 1. The city of Watertown, for the purpose of electing justices of the peace, shall be divided into three districts, as follows, to wit: 1st district, comprising the first, second and seventh wards of said city; 2d district, comprising the third and fourth wards of said city; 3d district, comprising the fifth and sixth wards of said city.

Terms of office.

SECTION 2. There shall be elected by the qualified electors of said city, at the next election of city and ward officers, to be held on the Tuesday succeeding the first Monday of April, A. D. 1879, one justice of the peace for each of the said districts: *provided*, the justice of the peace elected for the first district shall hold his
