CHAPTER 106.

AN ACT in relation to the state historical society, and appropriating a sum of money.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

State to pay for miscellaneous job printing, binding, etc.

SECTION 1. That portion of section three hundred and seventy-five, chapter twenty-four of the revised statutes, relating to the state historical society, which reads as follows: The state printer shall bind, in half calf binding the British patent reports, and in suitable binding, all newspaper files which the society shall hereafter receive, under direction of the library committee, when approved by the governor; and said printer shall print such circulars and labels as the corresponding secretary may require, shall be amended by adding the following words: The secretary of state is directed to audit the same, and for these purposes a sufficient amount is hereby appropriated out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 107.

AN ACT relating to fences.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Description of legal fence.

SECTION 1. Any fence consisting of a combination of wire and pickets, constructed of posts securely set in the ground, not more than fifteen feet apart, connected by three or more wires not less in size than number nine wire, with pickets not less than four feet long, nor more than six inches apart, the pickets securely fas-
