

member of such corporation may withdraw therefrom at any time by giving notice in writing to the president, or, in his absence, to the secretary thereof, and paying his share of all claims then existing against said corporation; and the directors, or a majority thereof, or such and so many of them as they may have appointed as a committee for such purpose, shall have power to annul any policy by giving notice in writing to that effect to the holder thereof.

SECTION 7. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 147.

AN ACT to repeal chapter 248 of the laws of 1880, also to repeal chapter 296 of the laws of 1881, relating to fishways.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 248 of the laws of 1880, entitled "an act to compel the owners, proprietors and occupants of dams in the counties of Iowa and La Fayette, to construct and maintain fishways;" also chapter 296 of the laws of 1881, entitled an act in relation to fishways, and amendatory of chapter 248 of the general laws of the state of Wisconsin for the year 1880, entitled "an act to compel the owners, proprietors and occupants of dams in the counties of Iowa and La Fayette to construct and maintain fishways," are hereby repealed. Repeal.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 148.

AN ACT to appropriate to the Clark County Agricultural Society a sum of money therein named.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to the Clark County Agricultural Society, out of any moneys in the general fund not otherwise appropriated, the sum of one hundred dollars for the year A. D. 1881. Appropriation.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
