

the following: Nothing in this act contained shall be construed as authorizing the presiding judge in vacation to sign any judgment or order for judgment on the foreclosure of a mortgage or contract for the sale of land or judgments for divorce, except in cases where the application for judgment has been made at a general or special term of the court.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

### CHAPTER 181.

AN ACT to amend section 2 of chapter 184, laws of Wisconsin for the year 1880, entitled an act to authorize D. P. Simons to construct and maintain a dam across and otherwise improve Butternut Creek, in Price county, Wisconsin.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section 2 of chapter 184, general laws of 1880, is hereby amended by adding to the end of said section the following: Provided, however, that said D. P. Simons, his associates and assigns, shall build and maintain a fishway in said dam of sufficient size and constructed in such manner as to allow the free and unobstructed passage of fish through or over said dam, said fishway to be kept open and in repair during the existence of said dam, as authorized by the requirements of this charter. May construct a dam.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

### CHAPTER 182.

AN ACT to authorize John E. Glover, Isaac H. Wing, and William H. Phipps, their heirs or assigns, to erect, maintain and keep up a dam across the Totogaticanse river in Bayfield county, Wisconsin.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. John E. Glover, Isaac H. Wing and William H. Phipps, their heirs or assigns, are hereby authorized to erect, maintain and keep up a dam across May erect a dam.
