CHAPTER 106.

AN ACT relating to the election of, and regulating the tenure of office of the aldermen in the city of Ripon.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Relating to tenure of office in city of Ripon.

SECTION 1. At the next annual election for municipal officers of the city of Ripon, one of the aldermen for each ward of said city, shall be elected for the term of one year; one, from each of said wards, for the term of two years; and one, from each of said wards, for the term of three years; who shall hold their offices, respectively, for the terms of one, two and three years.

SECTION 2. At each annual election for municipal officers of the city of Ripon, after the time of the election of the aldermen, as provided for in the preceding section of this act, there shall be elected one alderman, whose term of office shall be for three years.

SECTION 3. Any vacancy that may happen in the office of aldermen in said city, by death, resignation, or otherwise, shall be filled in the same manner as is now provided by law, for filling vacancies in said office. And the person, so selected to fill such vacancy, shall hold said office during the unexpired term of the alderman, whose vacancy such person is so selected to fill.

SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with the provisions of this act, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
