## CHAPTER 248.

AN ACT relating to the distribution of the supreme court reports, and amendatory of section 357 of the revised statutes.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

Relating to  
distribution of  
supreme court  
reports.

SECTION 1. Section 357 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by inserting between the words "association" and "one" in the eighth line of said section, the following: "And also to every established public library containing five thousand volumes or more, upon application being made therefor." So that said section when so amended shall read as follows. Section 357. The supreme court reports, purchased in pursuance of section 347, shall be distributed as follows: To each of the justices of the supreme court, to each of the district judges of the United States in this state, to each judge of a court of record of this state, to each clerk of the circuit court, and to each of the clerks of the county and municipal courts of the county and city of Milwaukee, to the law department of the university, and to the Milwaukee law library association, and also to every established public library containing five thousand volumes or more, upon application being made therefor, one copy. The remaining copies so purchased shall be delivered to the state librarian, who shall stamp and keep in the library as many copies as may be necessary for the use thereof, and shall safely keep the remainder until required for further distribution by law.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
