CHAPTER 154.

AN ACT to facilitate the sale of a certain tract of state land therein described.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The commissioners of the public lands are hereby authorized and empowered to sell, for a sum not less than twenty dollars, on such terms as other state lands are sold, the tract described as follows: Lot numbered one, section twenty-seven, township twenty-one north, range thirteen east, in the county of Waupaca. May sell lands described.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 155.

AN ACT relating to special powers of county boards, and amendatory of section 670, chapter 36, of the revised statutes.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 670, of chapter 36, of the revised statutes, relating to special powers of county boards, is hereby amended by adding to said section, at the end thereof, as follows, to wit: 12. To procure transcripts or abstracts of the records of any other county affecting the title to real estate in such county, and such transcripts or abstracts shall be *prima facie* evidence of title. Powers of county boards.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after the date of its passage and publication.
