CHAPTER 229.

AN ACT to detach certain territory from the towns of Pine River and Ackley, in Lincoln county, and erect the town of Eagle River.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. All of the following described territory in Lincoln county, to wit: Towns thirty-eight (38), thirty-nine (39), forty* (40), forty-one (41), forty-two (42) and forty-three (43) north, of range nine (9) east; and towns thirty-eight (38), thirty-nine (39), forty (40), forty-one (41), forty-two (42) and forty-three (43) north, of range ten (10) east, are hereby detached from the towns of Pine River and Ackley, in the county of Lincoln, state of Wisconsin, and the same shall constitute the town of Eagle River.

Authorized to detach certain territory.

SECTION 2. The said town of Eagle River is hereby created and established with all rights, powers and privileges by law granted to and possessed by other towns of this state, and subject to all the general laws prescribed for the government of such towns.

Town created.

SECTION 3. The first election of town officers of said town of Eagle River, shall be held on the first Tuesday of April, A. D. 1885, at the store of Scott and Stewart, in the village of Eagle River, and the electors of said town shall, at the opening of the polls, elect the clerk and inspectors of election.

First election of officers, when held.

SECTION 4. The indebtedness to be apportioned to the town of Eagle River, to bear the same ratio to that apportioned to each of the other towns

In'ebtedness to be equally apportioned.

hereinbefore mentioned, as does the assessed valuation of that portion of the town detached bear to that situated in the town from which the said territory was detached by this act to the last assessment rolls of said towns, and the said town of Eagle River, shall pay its proportion of indebtedness ascertained as aforesaid to the towns of Pine River and Ackley, respectively.

This act shall not interfere with the collection and return of taxes.

SECTION 5. This act shall in no wise affect or invalidate the collection and return of taxes in either of the aforesaid towns hereinbefore mentioned, but the same shall be collected the same as if none of the territory of said towns had been detached, and said town of Eagle River erected.

SECTION 6. All acts or parts of acts conflicting with this act are hereby repealed.

SECTION 7. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
