CHAPTER 473.

AN ACT to define the rights of villages organized under chapter 40, revised statutes of 1878, in actions brought against said villages, and amendatory of said chapter.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Defining rights of villages organized under chapter 40, R. S. respecting license moneys.

SECTION 1. In all actions hereafter commenced or now pending, brought by any town against a village for the recovery of any license money paid to said village for the sale of malt, ardent or intoxicating liquors therein, where said village has appropriated and used said license money for the support of the poor therein, it shall be lawful for said village to answer the complaint of the town, alleging the fact that the license money so sued for by said town had been appropriated and used by the village for the support of the poor therein; and proof of that fact shall be a full and perfect defense to said action.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
