

SECTION 2. The sergeant-at-arms of the senate shall have authority to appoint two additional messengers, at two dollars per diem, compensation to commence after the legislature has been in session twenty days.

CHAPTER 8.

AN ACT to provide for the annual appropriation of a sum of money therein named to the state horticultural society.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is hereby annually appropriated to the state horticultural society, the sum of one thousand dollars.

CHAPTER 9.

AN ACT to appropriate to the commissioners of fisheries a sum of money therein named.

CHAPTER 10.

AN ACT to facilitate the sale of certain tracts of land therein named.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

county.

SECTION 1. The commissioners of public lands are hereby authorized and empowered to sell, for a sum not less than fifteen dollars, on such terms and conditions as other state lands are sold, certain tracts of land described as follows: Lot seven, section twenty-seven, and lot eight, section thirty-four, comprising a total of twenty-nine and fifteen one hundredth acres, all in township number seven, north of range number five west, situated in the county of Grant.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
