CHAPTER 438.

AN ACT to define the liability of railway corporations in relation to damages sustained by their employes.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Every railroad corporation doing business in this state, shall be liable for damages sustained by any employe thereof within this state, without contributing negligence on his part, when such damage is caused by the negligence of any train dispatcher, telegraph operator, superintendent, yard master, conductor or engineer, or of any other employe, who has charge or control of any stationary signal, target point, block or switch.

Liabilities of railroads for injuries sustained by employes—when damages caused by certain.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 439.

AN ACT to amend certain sections of the laws of 1887, relating to the drainage of Beaver Dam river, in Dodge county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 1, of chapter 528, general laws of 1887, is hereby amended by adding after the words, "adjacent to," where they occur in said section, the words, "or overflow or damaged by."

Amending ch. 528, laws 1887, drainage of Beaver Dam river, Dodge county.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
